

SPRING WEED CONTROL

EACH YEAR THE PROFESSIONALS who survey our lake identify those areas where the heaviest weeds are located and mark them for treatment.

On May 2, the Spring survey was done on Neponset Reservoir. Water Resource Services, whom the NRRC uses to do the survey, used underwater cameras and other tools to assess water quality and weed growth.

Here are the results of what was found and treated:

1. Fanwort: Overall, they determined Fanwort, our "usual" weed was fairly large for so early in the year, but there were mostly scattered small patches.

2. Variable Watermilfoil was found in scattered, small patches and there was some overlap with areas containing fanwort.

3. Curley leaf Pondweed was scattered and much less abundant than last year. This invasive plant has been present in the reservoir for many years, is more abundant in some years than others, but dies back in early summer, so it is not a major interference for boating and fishing during most summers.

4. Bigleaf Pondweed was abundant in many areas but was not as abundant as in recent years, consistent with 2023 results.

5. Nitella, a large alga that grows like a rooted plant, was again common, but is losing ground to the invasive species.

6. Filamentous green algae mats were detected and were fairly abundant in many areas. Floating masses were only noted in a few small coves due to wind activity.

7. Overall, the most populated area of weeds, mostly milfoil and fanwort, were found in the SW cove, which is over where Fish and Game Club is located.

On June 12, the lake weed treatment took place, which has helped severely cut back and/or alleviate some weeds from the lake.

We have noticed the treatment has taken very well and have heard from residents that the weeds are significantly reduced.

The NRRC will continue to annually monitor, work with our experts and take the most recommended path to keep our lake as weed-free and healthy as possible for all to enjoy.
